 - ii. Iowa (Patrick): Lidar working group met; weren't able to fly in the spring, still need more




- funding, discussing with NRCS. USGS 3DEP BAA coming out in October. Submitting data to census prior to August 1 deadline. ITAG meeting was in June.

Option #3
